Man Mo Temple

As one of the oldest temples in Hong Kong, Man Mo temple is well-known to be dedicated to the Chinese gods, Man (Literature) and Mo (Martial Arts).



The Peak (By Tram)

If you want to see the splendid view of Hong Kong Island and Kowloon Peninsula, you must not miss visiting The Peak which is the top one of the ten attractions in Hong Kong that tourists must go. In addition, to reach The Peak, you can take a ride on The Peak Tram that has been in operation since 1888. The steepest gradient is 27 degrees, which offers you an unforgettable journey.



Aberdeen Fishing Village

Star Ferry

The Star Ferry's ferry crossings at Victoria Harbour are acclaimed as an important part of the commuter system between Hong Kong Island and Kowloon, and essential journeys for visitors. The National Geographic Traveler named the ferry crossing as one of 50 places of a lifetime. The ferry ride is also well known as one of the world's best value-for-money sightseeing trips.



Old Clock Tower

The Clock Tower was part of former Kowloon Station of Kowloon-Canton Railway since 1915. The main terminus building was demolished in 1978 leaving only the clock tower. It is a landmark from the Age of Steam and has been listed as a declared monument in Hong Kong since 1990.



A symphony of lights

A symphony of lights has been awarded the world's "Largest Permanent Light Show" by Guinness World Records. The show combines interactive lights of 44 key buildings on both Hong Kong Island and Kowloon.



Avenue of Stars

The Hollywood style Avenue of Stars features plaques for honored movie celebrities on the walk of fame. It also features milestones and sculptures about Hong Kong film industry, along with kiosks selling souvenirs.
